In an environment of change and challenge, AmeriCares stands strong, ready and able to act on our mission to help people access quality health in times of disaster and every day.

In the U.S. and more than 85 countries around the world, each year, AmeriCares provides health programs that save and improve lives immediately and strengthen health for years to come.

The challenges are many: Poverty and disaster create barriers to health for millions of people. Natural disasters occur more frequently, and humanitarian crises last for years. One third of the world's population lacks regular access to essential medicine; half can't access the health services they need. Against this background, our vision remains clear: a world where there are pathways to health and opportunity for all.

Our strategy guides us. Heading into Fiscal Year 2025, we continued to deepen our impact, work locally and engage globally. With these objectives as our North star, we prioritize long-term, sustainable impact; deep engagement in the communities where we work; and participation in global discussion and actions around improving health.

Our programs improve health: We accomplish our work around three pillars: Medicine Security, Emergency Programs and Health Services.

Program Spotlight: Ukraine


In Lviv, Ukraine, Vitalina is fighting two wars. When she is not on the frontlines of the war with Russia, driving an ambulance, she is in a hospital, where her young daughter receives chemotherapy for cancer. In collaboration with local partner Tabletochki, AmeriCares supports the hospital with both chemotherapy medicine and mental health programs for patients and their families, including Vitalina and her daughter.
