Helping Ukrainians In The Fight Of Their Lives

Your support has helped AmeriCares provide 544 tons of medicine and medical supplies to the people of Ukraine since Russian forces invaded over three years ago.

Working in tandem with local partners, we are also providing critical medicine and support to children as they undergo cancer treatments amidst the horrors of war.

The mother of one young cancer patient described the trauma and fear following a cancer diagnosis as, "Now we have two wars—one in

our family and one in our country." Winning a fight against cancer is difficult under the best conditions. Doing it when hospitals have been reduced to rubble and bombs continue falling would be impossible without the kindness and generosity of AmeriCares supporters.

Lucy* was just one year old when she accidentally fell into a fire near her home in Uganda. Although Lucy survived the severe burns, extensive and painful scarring on her hands limited her mobility for the next 10 years.

That is when one of our Medical Outreach partners, Dr. David Kulber, and his team arrived in Uganda with medicine and supplies donated through the generosity of AmeriCares supporters.

Lucy's mother traveled with her by motorcycle taxi for an entire day to reach St. Mary's Lacor Hospital where Dr. Kulber was performing surgeries. It was an expensive and difficult journey in search of the life-changing care Lucy desperately needed.
